YES PLEASE:

- Cans
- Beer and soft drink cans (non-deposit)
- Capsules and lids
- Tealight holders
- Smaller pots and pans
- Cutlery
- Nails and screws

 (e.g. in a can or rolled inside steel
 wire or aluminium foil)
- Fixtures and mixer taps
- Metal coffee capsules without coffee
- · Aluminium foil
- Foil trays
- Scissors

- · Gas cartridges for grills
- · Gas cylinders
- Spray cans
- Metal with electronics or batteries
- Coffee capsules containing coffee
- Pressurised cylinders/containers
- · Metal with chemicals
- Syringes for health and safety at work reasons (take to the pharmacy)
- Bags with metal lining,
 e.g. crisps and coffee bags



YES PLEASE:

- Newspapers
- Adverts
- Printed material
- Magazines
- Leaflets
- Office paper
- Comics

- Milk and juice cartons
- Plastic covers and plastic films
- Wet/dirty paper
- Card packaging
- Wrapping paper and ribbon
- Books
- Baking paper, muffin cases, etc.

Food & beverage cartons



YES PLEASE:

- Plastic bottles (non-deposit)
- Plastic containers
- Plastic trays, tubs and lids
- Plastic bags (without metal film)
- Plastic foil and film + bubble wrap
- CD and DVD covers
- Plastic toys (non-electronic)
- Plastic tableware (not styrofoam)

Food and beverage cartons, e.g.:

- Milk cartons
- · Yoghurt cartons, rinsed
- Cartons for drinks, e.g. juice and cocoa
- Cartons for food, e.g. peeled tomatoes

- PVC e.g.: Rubber boots, rain clothes, balls, etc.
- Packaging from weedkiller, insecticides, etc.
- · Plastic medicine packaging
- Melamine, e.g. Margrethe bowls, etc.
- · Plastic with electronics
- · Bags with metal film, e.g. crisp bags
- Plastic bottles and containers with the following hazard labels - these must be disposed of as residual waste (empty)


YES PLEASE:

- Small cardboard boxes
- Corrugated cardboard
- · Cardboard packaging
- Card packaging
- Shoe boxes
- Cardboard tubes from kitchen and toilet rolls
- Card
- Egg boxes (clean and dry)

- Plastic covers and plastic films
- Wet/dirty cardboard
- Books
- Wrapping paper
- Pizza boxes
- · Birthday cards with sound
- Paper cups and other plastic-coated cardboard
- Food and beverage cartons
- Polystyrene



Food waste

YES PLEASE:

- Fruit & vegetables
- Paper coffee filters and teabags
- Egg shells
- Meat and cold cuts
- Fish and seafood
- Small bones (poultry, pork ribs and lamb)
- Bread, cakes, rice and pasta
- Cheese and dairy products
- Fat and gravy
- Flower bouquets
- Dirty paper towels

- Textiles
- Empty packaging incl. biodegradable plastic
- Cotton buds and nappies
- Pizza boxes
- Potted plants and soil
- · Ash and cigarette butts
- · Hygiene waste, e.g. sanitary pads
- Aluminium foil
- · Dead animals
- Cat litter
- · Animal bedding
- Garden waste/pot plants
- Napkins
- Baking paper, muffin cases, etc.



Residual waste



- Dirty paper and cardboard
- Napkins
- Nappies and sanitary towels
- Cotton buds
- Vacuum cleaner bags (securely wrapped)
- Ash (securely wrapped)
- Cigarette butts
- Sweepings (securely wrapped)
- Cat litter
- Small pet bedding
- · Animal droppings
- Polystyrene
- Bags with metal lining, e.g. crisps and coffee bags

- Recyclable waste
- Stones and soil
- Dead animals
- Clothes and textiles
- Hazardous waste
- · Bulky waste

Glass



YES PLEASE:

- Glass bottles (non-deposit)
- Food jars
- Glass packaging
- Drinking glasses
- Glass vitamin bottles
- Glass shards from all the above

- Porcelain
- Flat glass
- Ceramic/stoneware
- Chemical bottles
- Mirrors
- Light bulbs
- Fireproof glass, e.g. ovenproof dishes
- Medicine bottles



Hazardous waste



Your property has an environmental waste cabinet or an environmental waste container for hazardous waste, and may also have a battery container for used batteries.

Ask the person responsible for waste in your property about how to handle hazardous waste

Leftover medicines and packaging, as well as syringes, should be taken to a pharmacy. Illegal fireworks and explosives must be handed over to the police.

YES PLEASE:

- Leftover paint
- Spray cans
- Thermometers
- Fertiliser
- · Descaling agents
- · Oil residues
- Light sources (bulbs, LED bulbs, etc.)
- Chemicals (in original packaging)
- Weedkiller from household use
- Poison for vermin
- Printer cartridges
- Nail polish and nail polish remover
- Empty packaging marked with one of the hazard labels "acute toxicity" or "hazardous to health".

- Spontaneously combustible rags and liquids
- Fireworks
- · Pressurised cylinders
- Ammunition, explosives and weapons
- · Syringes and leftover medicines
- Sharp objects such as broken glass and knives



Textile waste



When you sort your textile waste, you should put it in the bags provided by Hillerød Forsyning. Ask the waste manager where the red textile waste bags are stored.

Tie a tight knot at the top of the bag.

Textile waste bags should be delivered to the recycling centre or collected as bulky waste from your property.

Ask the person responsible for waste in your property about textile waste and where it should be left for collection.

YES PLEASE:

Textile waste in the form of worn-out clothing and textiles that are worn, holey, stained or ruined. e.g.:

- Blouses and trousers
- Underwear and socks
- Sportswear and swimwear
- Cloth nappies (clean)
- · Parts and pieces of clothing
- Towels and flannels
- Tea towels and dishcloths
- Tablecloths and bed linen.
- Soft toys
- · Textile net and rag rugs
- Duvets, pillows, cushions

NO THANKS:

Clothing and textiles that are:

- Recyclable clothing and textiles Leather clothing and rainwear
- · Wet or mouldy
- · Contain leftover food
- Contain chemicals



Bulky waste

Bulky waste refers to items that would fall out of the house if the house was turned upside down or which you would take with you if you moved.

Ask the person responsible for waste in your property about bulky waste and where it should be left for collection.



YES PLEASE:

Household contents, e.g.:

- Furniture
- Garden chairs and cushions
- Rugs
- Paintings
- Electronics e.g. household appliances, computers, printers, etc.
- White goods

- Construction waste
- Packaging
- Hazardous waste
- Porcelain and ceramics, as well as parasol feet, etc.
- TV and flat screens (take to recycling station)
- Pallets

Sort your waste correctly

In Hillerød, we sort waste so that we can reuse the valuable materials found in the waste. The better you sort your waste, the more we can reuse it to make new products.
